Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the general public that a **quorum of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission** may attend the Navajo Nation Traditional Feast in association with the 2016 Southwest Regional Conference of the Native American Fish and Wildlife Society on **Tuesday, August 9, 2016 from 6:00 PM – 9:00 PM at the Raymond Wildlife Area**, located 30 miles east of Flagstaff off I-40, exit #225, (Buffalo Range Road), south on dirt road approximately 10 miles to the wildlife area headquarters.

The purpose of attending this event is to become introduced to tribal wildlife conservation leaders from the southwest and to participate in the Traditional Feast hosted by the Navajo Nation. A quorum of the Commission will not discuss, take or propose any legal action.
